



Hon. Soraya Martinez Ferrada, P.C., M.P.

A resident of Eastern Montreal since she came to Canada from Chile as a political refugee in 1980 with her family, Soraya Martinez Ferrada is an experienced leader in the communications and project development fields through her involvement in the community and cultural and economic sectors for over twenty years.

With deep roots in the community and cultural sector, Soraya participated in the founding of TOHU, an entertainment complex in Montreal, where she created the very first cultural and socio-professional integration program.

Soraya has been involved in Montreal politics for more than ten years, being elected as city councilor for Saint-Michel in 2005, before being appointed to the executive committee. She also served as Louise Harel's Chief of Staff for the Official Opposition at Montreal City Hall, and then as Executive Director of Vision Montréal before it merged with Coalition Montréal.

In 2019, Soraya won a historical victory to become the first Liberal MP for Hochelaga in 35 years. Since 2019, she has held multiple roles as a Parliamentary Secretary, including in the areas of Immigration, Transport, and Housing. In 2023, Soraya was appointed as Minister of Tourism and the Minister responsible for the Economic Development Agency of Canada for the Regions of Quebec. In her new role, she has been a leading voice for the tourism sector across Canada, and a fierce advocate for economic prosperity in Quebec.

Soraya's commitment and dedication to growing our middle class, strengthening our local economy, and standing up for families in our community make her the best person to represent the voices of Hochelaga in Parliament.



Terry Duguid, M.P.

Born and raised in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Terry Duguid has a lifetime of experience serving his community. His early years were often spent at the local curling rink with his four brothers, his mother Georgina, and his father, world champion curler, Don Duguid. He began his post-secondary education at Carleton University, where he earned his Bachelor of Science with a major in biology, followed by a Master's degree in Environmental Science from the University of Calgary.

Throughout his career, Terry has always maintained a strong commitment to public service. From 1989-1995, he served as a City Councilor in Winnipeg, representing the wards of Miles Macdonell and North Kildonan. From 1995-1997 he was president and CEO of Gateway North International, which was responsible for promoting trade through the port of Churchill. In 1997 he founded Sustainable Developments International, a firm specializing in environmental management and sustainable development. In 2000, he was named Chairman of the Manitoba Clean Environment Commission, and in 2004 he became President and CEO of the International Centre for Infectious Diseases.

Terry was first elected as the Member of Parliament for Winnipeg South in 2015, and has since been re-elected in 2019 and 2021. During his time in Parliament, Terry has served as the parliamentary secretary to several ministers, including the Minister of Families, Children and Social Development, the Minister for the Status of Women, and the Minister of Economic Development and Official Languages. He currently serves as the Parliamentary Secretary to the Prime Minister and Special Advisor for Water.

During his time in Parliament, Terry has served in many roles within the Liberal Party. He served as the co-chair of the Liberal Biennial Policy Convention in 2016, chair of the Prairies and North Caucus from 2019-2021, and Liberal platform co-chair for the 2021 election. He currently serves as chair of the Manitoba caucus.
